Storm Safety in Middlesex



The Borough of Middlesex would like to remind residents and visitors that storms can present unexpected and dangerous conditions. To minimize these risks, we encourage drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians to follow storm advisories and remind property owners to be vigilant in the maintenance of trees and to ensure that any loose outdoor furniture is secured. We encourage you to visit our website for a full list of tips on how to stay prepared. Please review the following safety procedures in regards to storms in our area:

Thunderstorms

Thunderstorms can bring heavy rain, powerful winds, lightning, and even flash flooding. Stay up-to-date with local weather news and prepare in advance of any storm. Secure all outside furniture by tying it down or placing it in a safe storage space, and trim trees that may be in danger of falling or near power lines. If you notice a fallen branch or downed power line, report it immediately to authorities.

Severe Weather

Severe weather creates hazardous conditions for property owners and motorists alike. Though severe weather is unpredictable, there are measures that can be taken to help prepare in the event conditions should occur. Be sure to also avoid leaving your home during severe weather conditions if possible and to do all storm preparation in advance.

Power Outages

Storm conditions can lead to a greater risk of power outages in your area. This can impact many businesses, services, and individual residents. Preparing for a power outage is extremely important before inclement weather arrives. If you notice a power line that is broken or fallen, call the authorities immediately.

Tree Maintenance

During any storm, tree maintenance is extremely important. This helps keep roadways and individual properties safe. Report any tree problems or concerns in your neighborhood to our website portal immediately.
