



# Spring is a time when flowers bloom, grass grows – and burglars, thieves and scammers are more active. Remember:



**Unlocked vehicles** are popular targets for opportunistic sneakthieves. Residents are urged to lock their vehicles when they are unattended and keep valuables stored out of view of prying eyes.



Burglars often pose as solicitors, enabling them to approach homes to determine if anyone is present, without arousing suspicion. For this reason, the Borough of Middlesex requires that all solicitors obtain a license before engaging in such activity. If you suspect that someone is soliciting without a license, please report them to the police.



Spring is also popular time for yard sales and garage sales. Residents are reminded that New Jersey law prohibits signs from being "painted, drawn, erected or maintained upon trees, rocks, other natural features or public utility poles".

You may stake signs advertising your sale on your property, or on private property with the permission of the property owner. We also ask prospective buyers to make sure to obey all traffic and parking laws while attending a garage, yard or estate sale.



During Spring Cleanup, **trim bushes**, **shrubs and trees** so that they don't provide concealment for would-be burglars.



Spring brings the increased use of our parks and ballfields. Those that choose to use these recreational areas to walk their dogs are reminded that it is their responsibility and it is the law to clean up after their pet and to keep their dog on a leash. Our children depend on these parks, schoolyards and ballfields for recreation. Dog feces, when not disposed of properly, is a health hazard and an environmental hazard.

## **Warm Weather Brings With It Increased Pedestrian Traffic**

### **KEEP THESE TIPS IN MIND:**



### **Pedestrians:**

- Always cross at corners, within marked crosswalks where available.
- If crossing in other locations, yield the right of way to vehicles. Failure to obey the law carries a \$54 fine (court costs additional)
- Look left, right and left again before crossing. Watch for turning cars.
- Always walk facing traffic.
- Obey traffic signals, especially "Walk/Don't Walk."
- Remain alert! Don't assume that cars are going to stop.
- Wear reflective clothing when walking at night.
- Stay sober. Walking while impaired greatly increases your chances of being struck.



### **Motorists:**

- Stop for pedestrians in marked crosswalks. Failure to stop carries a \$200 fine (court costs additional), a 2 point license penalty, 15 days community service, and insurance surcharges.
- Watch for pedestrians when turning right on red.
- Obey speed limits.
- Do not block or park in crosswalks.
- Keep your windshield clean for maximum visibility.
- Be alert for pedestrians at all times.

## Share the Road: It's Everyone's Responsibility







Milder temperatures also mean that there will be more people taking to the roads on **bicycles** and **motorcycles**. Drivers should be mindful that bicyclists and motorcyclists have the same rights as you. They also face unique safety challenges, such as being smaller and less visible. Look for cyclists before making a left-hand turn at an intersection. Also, be aware that motorcyclists may have to downshift and weave to avoid bumps and road hazards so follow at a safe distance.


## Residents! Sign Up for Nixle Community Notifications and Alerts






# Internet **Exchange** Zone

## **Bulk Pick Up**

Got Junk? The Borough of Middlesex is here to assist residents with any of their spring clean ups. Bulk pickup is limited to one per year and is arranged by appointment only.



Rules are strictly enforced, so please read carefully.

Please do not place anything at the curb without scheduling an appointment.

Please call (732) 968-1603 between 6am and 2pm.
Please leave your name and number; your call will be returned within 24 hours to arrange for pickup.

Bulk collection is designed for residents that need to discard household trash that is too large or too much to place into your regular curb side garbage can.

Large appliances ("white metal") can be picked up by appointment throughout the year.

# **Bulk items NOT ACCEPTED curbside include:**

- Construction debris
- Propane tank
- Cement
- Television (accepted at the Recycling Center only)
- Hazardous materials
- Yard waste
- Tires and metal
- Pallets
- Lumber
- Fencing

# Grass, Leaves, and Branches

# GRASS WILL ONLY BE PICKED UP IN BIODEGRADABLE LEAF BAGS.

GRASS/LEAF COLLECTION: Grass and Leaf pick up will begin the last Wednesday of March and end on the last Wednesday of December. Place bags at curb the night before for pick up. Grass/leaves will only be picked up in paper biodegradable bags.

# Plastic bags will NOT be picked up.

Grass/leaves can also be taken to the Recycling Center. Refer to Ordinance #1727-06, Chapter 355 or call 732-968-1603 for more information.

### **BRANCH COLLECTION:**

Branches are accepted at the Recycling Center all year and must be tied and bundled in 4-foot sections. Only place branches at the curb on designated days (third Wednesday of the month from April thru October). Branches that are not tied and bundled will not be disposed of and will be subject to a violation.

## **Veteran Property Tax Changes**

On November 3, 2020, New Jersey voters approved a Constitutional Amendment, effective December 4, 2020, to eliminate the wartime service requirement for both the \$250 Veteran Property Tax Deduction and the Disabled Veteran Property Tax Exemption.

Beginning on December 4, 2020 to receive both these veteran benefits, active military service is still required as well as an honorable discharge. However, when and where the veteran served are no longer criteria for eligibility, as long as he or she was called to active duty. Reservists and National Guard personnel must still be called to active duty to qualify. Active Duty for Training continues to be non- qualifying.

With respect to the \$250 Veteran Property Tax Deduction, the pretax year is October 1, 2020 with the Deduction applied to the property's taxes for calendar tax year 2021.
